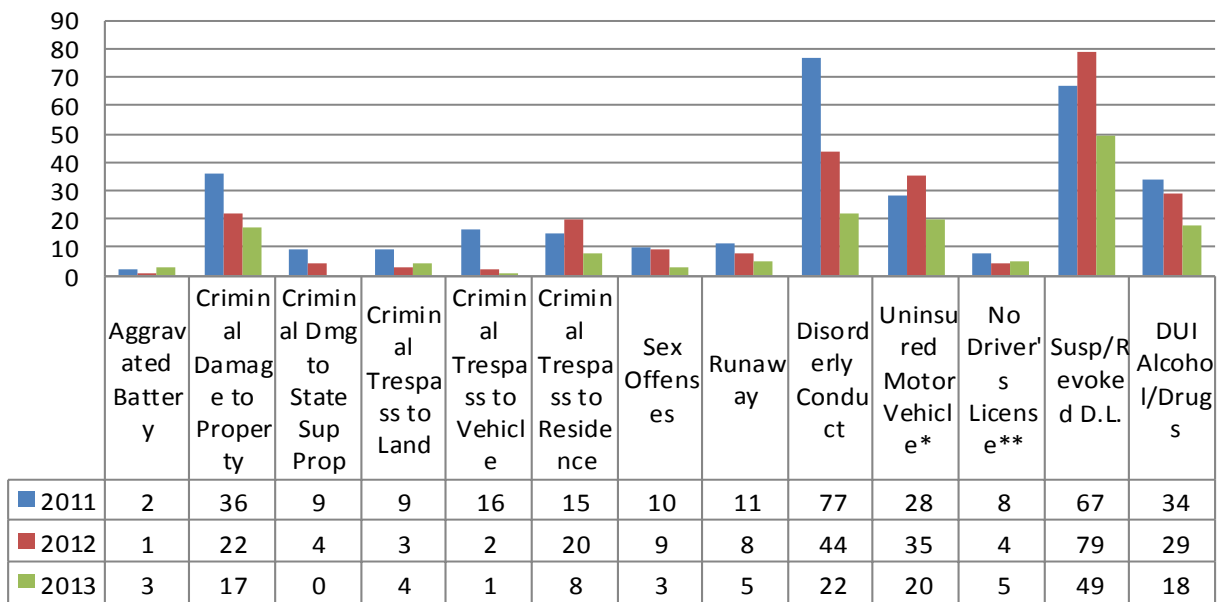

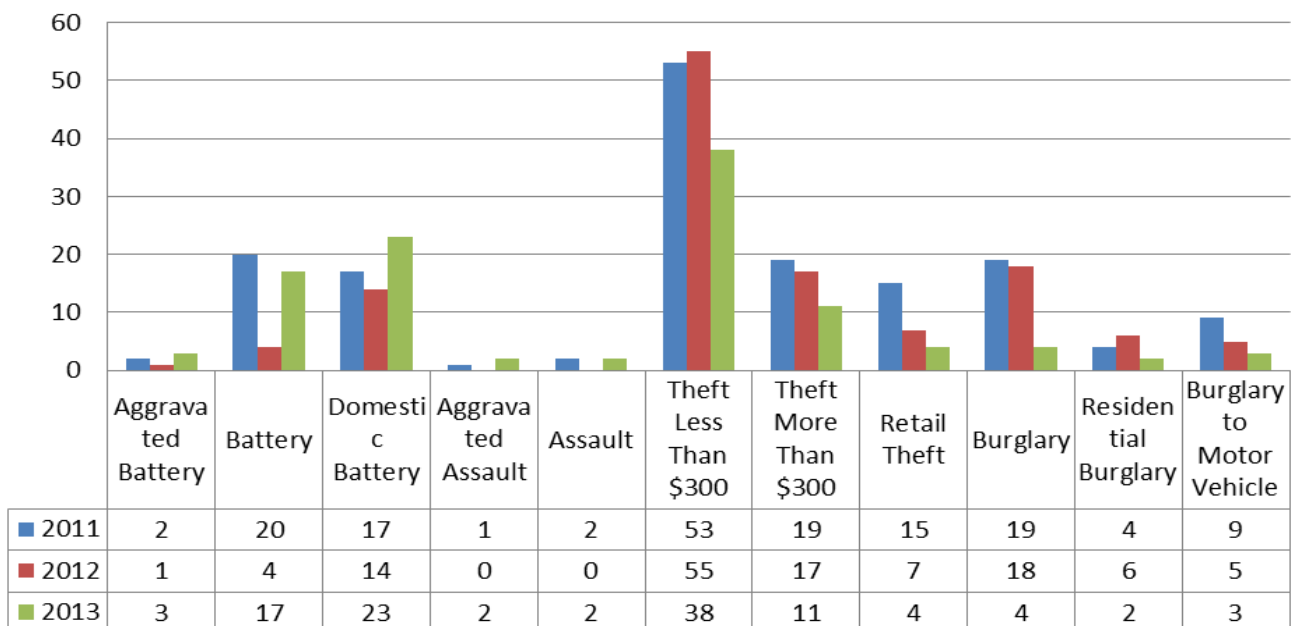

Below you will see a statistical comparison in crimes committed in Oregon from 2011-2013. You will notice that the majority of crimes has been reduced over the past three years. For example thefts under \$300.00 went from 53 in 2011 to 38 in 2013. Thefts over \$300.00 went from 19 in 2011 to 11 in 2013. We also saw a 78.94% decrease in Burglaries from 2011 to 2013.

2013 Community Interaction Programs

Full Scale Disaster Drill:

In May of 2013 the Oregon Police Department participated in a multi-agency full scale disaster drill. Chief DeHaan was selected as an evaluator for a tornado disaster at the Franklin Grove High School. This drill provided great insight on emergency response and community needs during a major disaster incident.

Community Safety Speech:

In June the Oregon Police Department conducted a community safety speech for members of the Village of Progress. Chief DeHaan talked with members about personal, financial, and residential safety issues.

Relay for Life Tug-o-War

Members of the Oregon Police Department competed against members of Byron Police and Fire as well as Oregon Fire Department.

Erin's Law Speech:

In August Chief DeHaan presented information on Erin's Law to members of the Ogle County CASA. The presentation covered current law requirements for school education as it relates to the law.

Current Drug Trends Speech:

In September Chief DeHaan presented information to the Oregon High School staff on current drug trends. Information included currently abused prescription drugs, signs of abuse, street names, and future trends.

RX Return Program October 24th.



The Oregon Police Department partnered with Ogle County LEADS and with the Ogle County Sheriff's department to participate in the DEA RX take back day on October 24th. Chief DeHaan attended the Senior Center Health Expo as part of the promotion for this event. Other law enforcement agencies in Ogle County also participated which resulted in over 1000 lbs of prescription drugs being collected and turned over to the DEA for disposal. Oregon PD continues to collect RX drugs via our drop box at City Hall.

Project LEADS Presentation:

December Chief DeHaan presented information on current drug trends to members of Project LEADS which included members from Ogle and Lee Counties.

2013 Special Programs and Grants

Tobacco Compliance

The Oregon Police Department continues to conduct Tobacco Compliance checks with our businesses. This program is organized and run by Officer Josh Fillers. There were no violations this year. It is our goal to maintain a 100% compliance rate when it comes to not selling tobacco product to our youth.

Mobile Field Force

Officer Kalnins continues to train and participate with the ILEAS Mobile Field Force. His training and participation is invaluable for the City of Oregon.

Grants and Donations

The Oregon Police Department continued to be active in seeking grant funding to offset the costs of operations.

COPS – We applied for a \$50,000 grant through the Department of Justice in hopes of using the money to purchase in-car video cameras. Unfortunately we were not chosen as a grant recipient this year.

Awards and Recognitions

On 03/12/13 at the Oregon City Council meeting Cpl. Joe Brooks received a letter of commendation and lifesaving pin from Mayor Thomas Stone and Oregon Police Chief Darin DeHaan. He was recognized for pulling a citizen from a burning vehicle which occurred on 02/27/13 at 4th and Collins Street. The driver was unconscious when Cpl. Brooks arrived at the scene. Cpl. Brooks had to break out the window to unlock the vehicle to get him out before pulling him to safety. The van was later totally consumed by fire.



In May Chief DeHaan was presented with the 2013 Outstanding Alumnus award from Sauk Valley Community College. He accepted the award during SVCC commencement ceremonies.



Training

The Oregon Police Department continues to proactively train and educate all of our employees. Officers are required to receive a minimum of 40 hours of training each year.

In 2013 we continued to train for an emergency response at our schools. This year we partnered with Chief Joe Drought with the Rock Valley College. Chief Drought and his officers developed a training session to give teachers and staff some tools if they are required to confront an armed subject in the school. The training was presented to all staff at the Oregon Elementary School as well as the Oregon High School. We feel the training was well received. – Thank you to Chief Drought and his staff.

Lieutenant Shawn Melville organized and administered active shooter training for the Oregon Police Department. We have developed and trained on new tactics for this kind of response based on the latest studies of active shooters. In December we conducted single officer response to active shooter training.

Lt. Melville, and Sgt. Cropp continue to provide current an essential firearms training for the Oregon Police Department. We have implemented the use of several types of simmunition handguns and rifles to our firearms training. Live fire scenario training is of the utmost value to train each officer as effectively as possible.

In 2013 we partnered with Sauk Valley Community College in the purchase of a firearm simulator. The simulator allows the instructor to add multiple elements to an officer's response. The simulator tracks officer's use of force response. This tool is invaluable for use of force training of our officers. We will continue to utilize this new tool in 2014.
