AWARDS AND RECOGNITIONS





Training

State law now requires additional training for Illinois Police Officers. The Oregon Police Department has fully complied with the new requirements and continues to train in several important areas including but not limited to;

- Trauma-informed responses and investigations of sexual assault and sexual abuse.

The Oregon Police Department continues to proactively train and educate all of our employees. Officers are required to receive a minimum of 40 hours of training each year.
