
Business for - June 24th, 2022 - July 8th, 2022

City Administrator:

- Completed the Fy23 Budget Review with Comm Schuster and Mayor Williams. Completed some minor adjustments in preparation for Council review.

• I attended the ongoing Illinois Broadband Accelerate virtual meeting. A survey of internet speeds is being circulated throughout the region. We have placed info on the City's social media pages.



- We met with Region 1 Planning Council and a representative of BLINK to discuss EV charging station options. Sustainability Committee will me to provide recommendations to the City Council.
- Terry Plemmons, Bill Covell, Chris Manheim and I met with Greg Gates to discuss the upcoming ITEP grant. Provide details on our vision for the various recreation paths in Oregon.
- Began work on AOP requests and city services for the festival.
- Working with Lt. Brooks and the police department on new in car camera options. We are looking for a system to integrate in car and body cam video. Also looking at options for replacing our existing radar sign. I feel a trailer option give the department more flexibility in placement of the sign. The current sign does not work and requires signposts to mount it to.

- Sprayed St. Dept. maintained city properties for weeds.

- Removed 3 trees in house.

- Continued striping crosswalks and parking stalls.
- Installed parking signs at City Hall and on Hawk Drive.
- Installed new stop sign at 10th/Adams.
- Ground lips off sidewalks at 14 locations.
- Rebuild 2 catch basins.
- Removed weeds from flower beds at Coliseum.
- Set up filter room for upcoming fleet maintenance program.
- Inspected 2 police squads to determine remaining useful life.
