City Administrator:

- Congratulations to Chief Shawn Melville on his retirement from the Oregon Police
 Department. It's hard to put into words my admiration for his honorable law enforcement
 career over the past two decades. I appreciate his years of dedication to the police
 department as well as his service to the community. I wish him great success on his next
 adventure in the private sector.
- Continue to work with the grant team for the ITEP grant for the recreation path. Engineering budget has been completed by Willett Hoffmann & Associates. We have gathered several letters of support. Our grant writer is completing the narrative and preparing for the submission which is due September 30th. Things are coming together well.
- Addressed some additional concerns about parking along 1st Street. This project has created a great enhancement for visitors to our new Riverfront District businesses.
- The city has joined the Region 1 Planning Council out of Rockford. We were voted onto the Board of Directors for the North Council of Governments which are working on multiple legislative efforts on behalf of communities. I will represent us on the board and will be attending the quarterly meetings.
- We held our first meeting with NIU Center for Governmental Studies to plan for our updated Comprehensive Plan. Thank you for everyone who made the meeting as well as everyone who checked in after due to scheduling conflicts. I think this a great step for our community to envision what is next. We did receive our check from Ogle County ARPA Economic Development Grant for \$17,250 to offset some of the costs of this important project.
- I completed the 3rd Quarter progress report for the tree inventory grant. I am finalizing the grant paperwork for the Ogle County Solid was grant for our community clean up events.
- I attended the Rural Partners: Small Business Development webinar. Some great information and perspectives that we may be able to implement in our community.
- I worked with various commissioners, discussing potential programs and other visions for future projects. I am always glad to see the energy and dedication our elected officials put in for the betterment of our city and services. Thank you Comm Wilson and Liz Vos for all of the time spent on the Community Clean up event details. I know the weather did not cooperate, but the effort does not go un-noticed.

- Mayor Williams attended the IDOT Planning for Recovery event in Rockford and he has shared a wealth of information he gained at the event. I look forward to working on new projects, grants, and visons as they relate to the new information.
