### Oregon Tree Commission Board Meeting Jun 22, 2022

The meeting was called to order at 5:32pm by Mark. Kayse voted to approve the May 2022 meeting minutes and Tyler seconded.

The committee reviewed Terry Plemmons' comments on the ordinance and made some additional changes. Darin needs to address section 1.17 Cash bonds and update 1.14 Tree Board once council has officially approved the Board. Once those changes have been made, a clean copy will be sent to the Morton arboretum for their review as a required task for the grant completion.

The tree survey, which is also needed for the grant will begin Jun 23, 2022and should take approximately a month to complete. Once the ordinance is approved by Morton and the tree inventory is complete, we will receive the grant funds and can begin working on next steps, including tree replacement programs, updating the tree planting guidelines, etc.

# 1. Tree Board or Department

- May be a professional forester/arborist, an entire forestry department or a tree board
- Group of volunteer citizens charged by ordinance with developing and administering a tree management program
- Legally responsible for the management of the community's trees





## 2. Tree Care Ordinance

- Establishes a tree board and gives it responsibilities
- Guidance for planting, maintaining and removing trees on public property
- Provides an opportunity to set good policy that is legally enforceable







- 3. Community Forestry Program With Annual Budget of at Least \$2 Per Capita
- Percentage of city workers' salaries spent on tree care
- Tree planting/watering/fertilizing
- Equipment rental/purchase/maintenance
- Arbor Day expenses
- Tree care conferences, workshops, memberships
- Value of volunteer labor





4. Arbor Day Observance and Proclamation

Opportunity to inform and engage the broader community through:

- Tree Planting
- Awards Ceremony
- Education

- Apply at arborday.org/TreeCityUSA




