Mark Herman called the meeting to order at 4:30 pm.

**Update on Tree Plantings:** The public works department has finished the 1<sup>st</sup> round of tree plantings. About thirty trees have been planted and another twenty-five are planned to be planted this year. The recent storms have been hard on the recently planted trees. Tie down kits have been ordered to help with the leaning trees. The committee discussed the PH of the water being used to water the trees. They also discussed tree plantings on the highway. Bill is checking the regulations with IDOT. An Arbor Day event was held at the city dog park.

**Update on Bird City:** Caleb, Terry and Tom have been working on the Bird City designation. They organized a bird counting event and Caleb documented everything. A proclamation was made by the Mayor and a resolution passed by the City Council.

**Forestry Plan:** When the city applied for Tree City, Morton Arboretum asked for the city to create a forestry plan. The plan would create a strong future for the protection of trees. Grants can be applied for to help with costs. The city will need to look at larger tree planting opportunities. Darin said he would bring some examples of other forestry plan to the next meeting.

Other Business: Quentin Snook has decided not to join the Tree Board.
