Council Member Melanie Cozzi moved to approve Ordinance 2025-015 Rezoning Property from Industrial to R-1 Residential – 307 S. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street parcel #16-03-185-007, 309 S. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street parcel #16-03-185-008, & 311 S. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street parcel #16-03-185-009, Seconded by Council Member Tim Krug.

**Discussion:** This ordinance is due to a request from one of the homeowner's. The east side of the three parcels were zoned as Industrial and should be R-1 Residential. The approval of the ordinance finalizes the process.

Ordinance 2025-016 24.22 Parking or Storage of Recreational Vehicles and Trailers in Residential Districts – 1<sup>st</sup> Reading – City Manager Darin DeHaan said the ordinance did not carry over when the city codes were updated. The Planning Commission discussed RV's being used as permanent residences. The committee discussed providing a free permit to allow for temporary residence of RV's for up to two weeks. He also said the city is a recreational community. Other complaints received were regarding weeds and grass growing around the recreational vehicle. The city council talked about fees, notices, inspections, and storage facilities. Council Member Terry Schuster asked

how many of these types of units would be in violation of the proposed ordinance. City Manager Darin DeHaan said he can get that information. He asked the City Council for input and guidance.

**Discussion:** Approval of the city zoning map is an annual requirement; it also includes the changes made to the three parcels included in Ordinance 2025-015.

Council Member Melanie Cozzi moved to go to Bid for 7<sup>th</sup> Street Watermain Replacement this Fall 2025, Seconded by Council Member Tim Krug.

**Discussion:** Public Works Director Bill Covell said the location is the seven hundred block between Franklin and Monroe Street. City Manager Darin DeHaan said there are five homes that have been served by a small water line for years. Fehr Graham has provided estimates for replacement of the watermain. If the city chooses to have the watermain replaced by directional boring the cost would be about two hundred and thirty-five thousand dollars. The other option is open cut, estimated cost for that is two hundred and seventy-five thousand dollars. Public Works Director Bill Covell also stated there is an eight-inch gas main located close to where the water line runs. In consideration of this, he felt directional boring would be best for this project. If the council approves, the project would be bid in late September/early October.

<u>Public Works Director Bill Covell:</u> Milling 10<sup>th</sup> and Monroe Street will be starting back up on Monday. Slurry seal will begin mid next week.

#### **Council Reports**

<u>City Council Member Melanie Cozzi:</u> The Farmer's Market will be hosting a stuff the bus event on Thursday to help support the Oregon Elementary School. This will be the last Farmer's Market event held down by the river. Starting August 7<sup>th</sup>, the Farmer's Market will be collaborating with the Oregon Park District. The Farmer's Market and Brown Bag Lunches will be held at Sarah Phelps Plaza.

<u>Council Member Josiah Flanagan:</u> Praised the Oregon Police and Public Works Department on a fantastic job with storm cleanup.

<u>Mayor Ken Williams:</u> The cities marketing campaign on social media had 3.8 million views, four thousand people were interested enough to save the information for later viewing.

Mayor Ken Williams stated the City Council will be going into Executive Session to discuss the purchase of real property and employee compensation. The City Council will be voting after the conclusion of executive session on the purchase of real property.

Council Member Melanie Cozzi moved to go into Executive Session to discuss the purchase of real property and employee compensation at 6:05pm, Seconded by Council Member Tim Krug.

#### CITY OF OREGON ORDINANCE 2025-016

**NOW THEREFORE**, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Oregon, in the State of Illinois, as follows:

**SECTION 1:** <u>ADOPTION</u> "24.22 PARKING OR STORAGE OF RECREATIONAL VEHICLES AND TRAILERS" of the City of Oregon Municipal Code is hereby *added* as follows:

#### BEFORE ADOPTION

24.22 PARKING OR STORAGE OF RECREATIONAL VEHICLES AND TRAILERS (Non-existent)

#### AFTER ADOPTION

# 24.22 PARKING OR STORAGE OF RECREATIONAL VEHICLES AND TRAILERS(Added)

#### A. Definitions:

RECREATIONAL VEHICLE: A vehicle designed for temporary living quarters, typically used for recreational, camping, or travel purposes including, but not limited to camping trailers, boat trailers, boats, snowmobiles, snowmobile trailers, all-terrain vehicles, camping buses, camping trucks, and house trailers. They can be self-propelled or designed to be towed by another vehicle.

#### A. General Standards

- 1. At no time shall a parked or stored recreation vehicle be used for living, sleeping, or housekeeping purposes, except as may be provided in accordance with subsection (6) of this section.
- 2. Recreational vehicles shall not be used as accessory structures in any district.
- 3. Recreational vehicles shall not have their wheels removed or be affixed to the ground as to prevent ready removal of the vehicle.
- 4. Recreational vehicles shall not be parked or stored in a way as to create a dangerous or unsafe condition.
- 5. No recreational vehicle, including attachments and appurtenances, shall be parked within one foot of a public sidewalk, right-of-way, or alley.
- 6. The ground under and surrounding where any such recreational vehicle is parked or stored must be kept free of noxious weeds, overgrowth, or debris.
- 7. No recreational vehicle shall be used for storage of goods, materials, or equipment other than those considered part of the unit or essential to its intended or immediate use.

- 8. No recreational vehicle shall be connected to electric, gas, water, or sanitary sewer service, except for temporary service connection for maintenance or immediate trip preparation.
- 9. No recreational vehicle may be temporarily occupied for more than 14 days in any six-month period to accommodate visitors; Use of internal cooking and sanitary facilities shall not be permitted.
  - a. A 14-day permit must be obtained from the City Clerk
    - (1) There will be no fee for the permit.
    - (2) The permit must be displayed on the recreational vehicle where it can be seen from the street.

#### B. Parking and Storage Restrictions

- 1. Recreational vehicles may be stored in rear yards on a temporary surface, including but not limited to patio blocks, or similar material.
- 2. Not more than two recreational vehicles may be parked or stored in the open in a front or corner side yard on a lot in a residential district.
- 3. Recreational vehicles may be parked or stored in the side yard and rear yard, subject to the standards set forth in this section, but no more than one of the side yards of any residential lot may be used for parking or storage of recreational vehicles.
- 4. Recreational vehicles, such as, but not limed to, camping trailers, boats trailers, boats, snowmobiles, snowmobile trailers, all-terrain vehicles, camping buses, camping trucks, and house trailers, shall not be parked or stored in any front yard or corner side yard in any residential district unless the vehicle is located on hard-surfaced driveway and complies with the standards of the Oregon City Code.
- 5. For the purpose of this subsection the term "storage" shall mean a vehicle parked on the zoning lot for more than 48 hours in any 72-hour period.
