Commissioner Collins opened the only bid received for the purchase of a City owned lot at 404 South Tenth Street. The bid was submitted by Doug and Donna Harriet in the amount of \$5,500.00. Attorney Smith advised that the Council has 30 days to decide whether they want to accept the bid. He suggested the Council decide by the next meeting. Council agreed.

Bid For Property

Frank Spielman submitted a letter to the Council requesting to have the City Code 4-1 (Junkyards) amended to exclude all nontoxic recyclable products. He also requested written permission from the City, in accordance with the City Solid Waste Code, to collect recyclable materials within the City limits. He advised that he and Lawrence Lambe are pursuing a business venture of setting up a recycling center at 103 Washington, which is zoned industrial. The Council will take it under advisement.

Request

Attorney Smith advised that he had received an appraisal for the Carnation property from William Jenks. It will be available for inspection in the City Clerk's office.

Reports

Mayor Barnes submitted a letter he received from Illinois Dept. of Commerce and Community Affairs to the Council in regard to a poultry processor looking for a site in Illinois to build a processing facility. They are asking if the City of Oregon is interested and if so, to reply immediately so the City can be included in planned meetings within the next two weeks. The Council agreed this should be pursued.

Mrs. Brass addressed the Council with a complaint of a broken water line servicing 102-104 and 105 South Eighth Street. These are private lines which have been repaired numerous times over the years. Commissioner Lauer will look into it.

John Priller asked the Council to consider a beautification program for the City to replace trees in the terraces that have been removed. The Council will look into it.

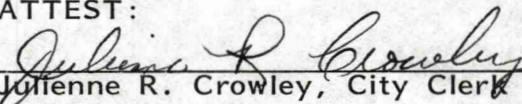
There being no further business, Commissioner Collins moved that the meeting be adjourned. Seconded by Jim Lauer.

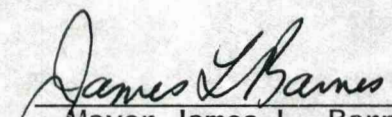
