Mayor Barnes advised the Council he had received a certificate of Appreciation from the Civil Air Patrol for the use of the Community Room for their meetings.

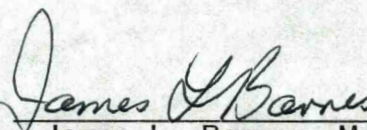

Seconded by Jim Lauer.

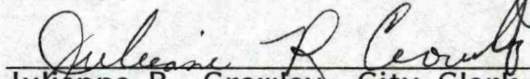
