- 3. Advised that Chief of Police Tom Miller is in the process of purchasing a home in Oregon but will not take possession until June 1985. Miller is requesting to live at his wife's residence in Byron during the interim from February 15th until June. Attorney Smith advised that as long as he retains an Oregon address, there should be no problem. The Council then approved the request.
- Advised he has received complaints on Wayne Sanner living in a camper shell parked in the back of his property at 605 South Third Street. This is in violation of our trailer ordinance, Chapter 5-10-1. The Clerk was instructed to notify Sanner that he has five days to vacate the camper.
- 5. Feels that since our license fee structure has not been adjusted since 1968, it should be reviewed and changed. His recommendations are:

Liquor License - Class A - \$900.00 Class B - \$600.00

Class C - \$900.00

Class E - \$400.00 or \$500.00

Bowling Alley - \$25.00 per lane.

The Council will review the fees and take action at a later date.
