The Oregon Chamber of Commerce proposes that the Chamber's office be relocated into the newly expanded Oregon City Hall building. Such a move would allow increased coordination of services offered to both the Oregon community and visitors to the area.

The Chamber requests that the City provide space for a Chamber desk, file cabinets and brochure display. The Chamber also asks that the City take messages when Chamber personnel are unavailable and provide photo-copies at a to-be-determined cost.

The Chamber will furnish its own desk, chair, files, phone service, basic office supplies and part-time clerical help.

The Chamber requests that this move be completed by February 15, 1986.

I would like to propose that the City of Oregon once again contract me to produce and direct the summer concerts on the square. These performances should be held during late July and early August so as not to interfere with the school schedules. Three or four concerts would be appropriate for the season.

The total cost for the concerts would be \$900.00 each. This would include all expenses, rehearsals, performances, music, office supplies, etc.

Engineer's Report:

Engineer's Report

1. Plans for Franklin Street project are complete. There can be no angle parking between Fifth and Sixth Streets on Franklin if Motor Fuel Tax funds are used. The State does not allow it. If the City wants angle parking for the one block, \$40,000.00-\$45,000.00 would have to come from other funds. Without the angle parking, the cost estimate for the job is \$185,000.00. This is from Mix Street to Fifth Street on Franklin.

2. 1986 Seal Coat Maintenance cost to do 3.2 miles is estimated at \$43,000.00.

3. Miscellaneous water repairs:

a. Fifth Street, Madison to Washington, \$45,000.00

b. Seventh Street - Webster to Route #2 - \$35,350.00 - to loop the lines and connect Sixth, Seventh & Eighth Streets, an estimated additional \$34,300.00 plus obtaining two easements, Aurand's and the gas station at Seventh Street and Route #2.

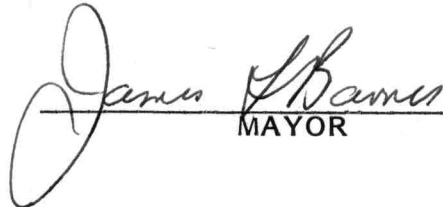
