This fund would be to loan out for a low interest rate to manufacturers and then when repaid to loan out again. Ellen Burgeson, Grant Consultant could prepare the CDAP Economic Development application for the city. Her fee would be \$30.00 per hour, not to exceed \$4,500.00.

Reports

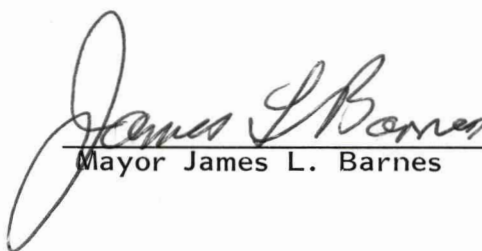
