Engineer's Report

Police Chief Report

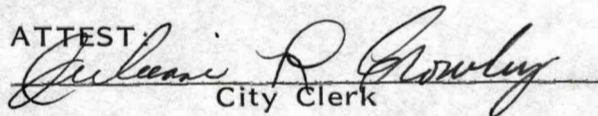
There being no further business, Commissioner Collins moved that the meeting be adjourned.
Seconded by Elma Braden.

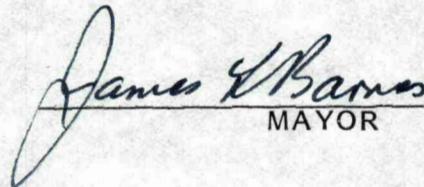
