Dennis McMullen gave the following engineer's report:

Engineer's Report

1. Most materials for the river crossing should be available by Tuesday, November 13th. The actual river crossing will take about two weeks.

2. In regard to the proposed ordinance setting up regulations for broadcast receiving antennas, Mr. McMullen advised that an antenna should not be located on a dedicated utility easement.

3. Seventy out of a hundred questionnaires have been returned from East Oregon residents. All but three wish to participate.

4. A unilateral six month grant extension (April '85) has been awarded.

Attorney Smith stated residents were questioning signing the "release of claim" form. Engineer McMullen stated the release of claim applies only to those lines installed by the City. East Oregon property owners ineligible to have hook-up fees waived will be notified and informed of the approximate price of hook-up per service.

Mayor Barnes welcomed Barbara Campbell, a new correspondent for the Dixon Evening Telegraph.

New Correspondent

The council approved the issuance of a raffle license to Presbyterian Women.

Raffle License

Mayor Barnes signed a utility permit for Continental Telephone Company. Discussion was held concerning free service extended to utility companies being paid for by other consumers. Attorney Smith advised an ordinance should be drawn up only after the Illinois Commerce Commission reaches a decision.

Chief Miller announced that an arrest had been made in regard to a pumpkin being thrown through a City Hall Window.

Chief's Report

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Commissioner Braden inquired about the appraisal of city owned lots in East Oregon. Attorney Smith replied that the title company was not finished with its search.

Commissioner Report

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In regard to the public nuisance charge against Dean Johnson, Attorney Smith had indicated to Mr. Johnson's attorney that the City is willing to drop the charge if Mr. Johnson cleans up the property.

Commissioner Braden stated that people are still burning leaves in the street. Mayor Barnes informed her that she can notify the police department when future problems arise.

Commissioner Braden announced that an Oregon Ambulance Association Explorer Troop has been formed for young people between the ages of fourteen and eighteen. She feels it will be an asset to the community.

The council made additions and changes to proposed Ordinance No. 893 entitled "Broadcast Receiving Antenna Regulations". Mayor Barnes moved that an ordinance entitled "Broadcast Receiving Antenna Regulations" be introduced for public inspection. Seconded by James Ludwig.

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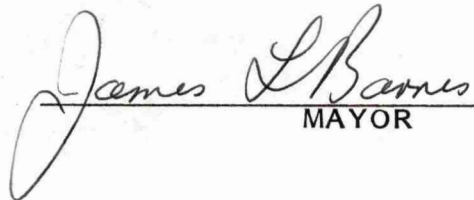
There being no further business, Commissioner Svoboda moved that the meeting be adjourned. Seconded by Elma Braden.

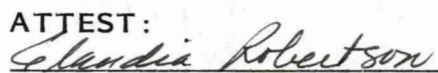
