The Council of the City of Oregon met in regular session Monday, March 14, 1983 at 7:00 P.M., City Hall Building.

Present: James Barnes, Mayor and Commissioners Robert Aurand, James Ludwig, Norman Collins. Absent: Commissioner Frank Svoboda.

Also present: Chief of Police Robert Jones and City Clerk Julianne Crowley.

Mayor Barnes opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Commissioner Collins moved that the minutes of the February 28, 1983 meeting be approved as recorded. Seconded by James Ludwig.

Said motion carried on roll call as follows: Ayes: Aurand, Ludwig, Collins, Barnes. No nays.

Mayor Barnes moved that Jim Gitz be appointed to represent the City of Oregon to lobby on HB 203 and SB 78 for a fee of \$750.00 immediate payment for expenses and an additional \$1,000.00 for compensation if both bills pass and are sent on to the governor. Seconded by Robert Aurand.

Said motion carried on roll call as follows: Ayes: Aurand, Ludwig, Collins, Barnes. No nays.

Mayor Barnes proclaimed March 29, 1983 Knights of Columbus Day.

The owners of the Tradewinds Tavern, David Sexton and Andrew Mondroski, attended the council meeting at the Council's request to discuss different problems which have occurred in

in the tavern. After a discussion on the violation of serving minors and of disturbances which have taken place in the establishment, the owners agreed to cooperate with the police and eliminate any violations or disturbances. Mayor Barnes advised the owners that this is a warning and if another complaint is received, they will be called in for a liquor hearing.

Odd Johnsrud, McClure Engineering manager, gave a report on various city projects.

Commissioner Collins moved to retain McClure Engineering for the design engineering on Oregon East for an amount not to exceed \$88,300.00, payments to be phased over one year at \$7,358.00. Payments to be scheduled after the preliminary work payments are completed as per February 24, 1983 letter. Seconded by James Ludwig.

Said motion carried on roll call as follows: Ayes: Aurand, Ludwig, Collins, Barnes. No nays.

Bill Messenger, owner of the Kopper Kettle Restaurant, Route #64 East, addressed the Council requesting a beer and wine license. He is going to have a grocery store in the east section of his building and would like to apply for a package goods beer and wine license. The Council advised him a public hearing would have to be held because that location is not zoned for a liquor license.

On behalf of the Auxiliary Police, Mayor Barnes presented Commissioner Aurand two tickets to the spaghetti supper to be held April 23rd, in appreciation of his years of service on the council.

The Council approved the Clerk's recommendation to issue a raffle license to the Auxiliary Police.

Mayor Barnes advised the Council that HB 203, amending the chlorination bill, will be presented for the first committee hearing on Tuesday, March 15, 1983 and SB 78 will be presented Wednesday, March 16, 1983. The Mayor will attend these hearings.

There being no further business, Robert Aurand moved that the meeting be adjourned. Seconded by James Ludwig.
