## COUNCIL MEETING MARCH 22, 1999

Mayor Barnes opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Commissioner Medlar moved that the March 8, 1999 meeting be approved as recorded, seconded by Robert Aurand.

Mayor Barnes moved that the City establish a business district street light account for the purpose of receiving community donations to assist in the expense of replacing the downtown street lights. I further authorize the Oregon Community Preservation Committee under the supervision of the Mayor to solicit donations for this purpose. Any donation of a least \$1,000.00 will cause the light pole to be memorialized in the name of the contributor's choice. Contributors wishing to make a memorial type donation must have the \$1,000.00 contribution paid in full by year end 1999. All memorial contributions must be made in the minimum \$100.00 installments. No interest or refunds will be paid to any contributors. This account will be under the sole authority and direction of the City Council with the advice of the Oregon Community Preservation Committee. If for any reason the funds established are insufficient to meet the street lighting purpose, the Council may apply all funds on deposit for other purposes as may be suggested by the Oregon Community Preservation Committee, Seconded by Gerald Medlar.

Commissioner Aurand moved to retain Lindgren, Calihan, Van Osdol & Co., to audit the City's records for the fiscal year ending April 30, 1999 for the amount not to exceed \$10,300.00 for the audit, Seconded by Gerald Medlar.

Roll Call: Aurand, Medlar, Barnes. No Nays.

Commissioner Aurand moved that Anne Holmes & Assoc., be retained to prepare the web site as per their proposal. The total amount to be paid by the city is not to exceed \$4,300.00. The yearly cost to the city will be \$800.00 for the hosting agreements. Any changes in materials for the web site will be approved by the City Council including the cost.

The following conditions must strictly be met for this to remain valid.

- 1. The City Council will give approval before any material will be shown on the "Web".
- 2. The City is to receive from Autumn on Parade Committee; the proceeds from future duck races on or before the first workday in December of each year.
- 3. Payment of the "Web" design agreement in the amount of \$3,500.00 is to be paid as follows:
  - A. 1/3 to be paid upon signing of the agreement
  - B. 1/3 to be paid within 60 days of the signing of the agreement
  - C. 1/3 to be paid upon completion of the web design.

The City believes that sufficient funds will be received from future duck races to repay this expenditure, Seconded by Gerald Medlar.

Commissioner Aurand moved that the City Council accept notification from the Oregon Library District Board of Trustees that the Board has rescinded its pervious motion seeking to establish an intergovernmental agreement concerning the coliseum. Effective this date, all negotiations concerning this matter are ended. A copy of the Library's notification is attached and made a part of this motion, Seconded by Gerald Medlar.
