The Council of the City of Oregon met in regular session Monday, May 23, 1983 at 7:00 P.M., City Hall building.

Mayor Barnes opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

The license to be issued for the period June 1, 1983 through April 30, 1984 and upon the forefeiture of the license held by John Willson, D/B/A Stenhouse. He further moved that the license fee for the period June 1, 1983 through October 30, 1983 in the amount of \$250.00 be approved. Seconded by Normam Collins.

Mayor Barnes proclaimed May 27 and 28, Buddy Poppy Days and June 10, 1983 - Tim Miller Day.

A copy of a letter written to Kenneth F. Plumb, Secretary of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission by City Attorney David Smith protesting the White Hydropower Company's Oregon Water Power Project, was submitted to the City Council.

Mayor Barnes advised the council that the Oregon Church of God was in the process of either leasing or buying a certain parcel of land from the Department of Conservation. The Department of Conservation advised them that they had to be certain it did not interfer with any city property or projects now under way. It was decided that a small lane on that parcel is actually included in land leased by the City from the Department

May 23, 1983 Meeting Continued of Conservation but the lane itself is considered by the City as a liability and therefore agreed to offically close off the lane thereby leaving this parcel clear for the Church of God to acquire. The clerk was advised to contact the Department of Conservation and inform them of this decision and also that the acquisition of this land would not interfer with any city projects. Dennis McMullen, representative of McClure Engineers, reported on various city projects, one of which was the Sanitary Sewer 8" line on Tenth Street and Pines Road. Attorney Smith was instructed to check with the bank on helping out on the cost of this project. Mayor Barnes submitted the following letter to the council: May 17, 1983 The Honorable James Barnes Mayor of Oregon c/o City Hall 115 North Third Oregon, IL 61061 Dear Mayor Barnes: A public warning system is being installed in the Commonwealth Edison Byron Station Emergency Planning Zone. This installation will include the positioning of a number of new sirens and the modification of some existing sirens to ensure total warning coverage for the area (10 mile radius of Byron Station). The modification of sirens presently in place in the area around the Village of Oregon will require the installation of radio decoders and the height of one siren raised. The location of sirens that need to be modified are listed below. This work is scheduled to be completed in July and you shall be kept advised as work progresses. Oregon - 4th St. & Webster (City Park near Tennis Courts) -Add radio control Oregon - 4th St. & Franklin (Coliseum - S.W. corner) -Add radio control Oregon - Jefferson Grammar School at 10th & Jefferson on north side of Jefferson St. (on roof) - Add radio control, set pole next to building and raise height of existing siren. Because approval by the municipality is necessary before modification can begin, I ask that you present this proposal to the Village Board at their next meeting for concurrence. Approval of this proposal is necessary to ensure that adequate warning can be given to the populace around the Byron Station. I will be pleased to work with you on a continuing basis to answer any questions and coordinate the modifications if you desire. Sincerely, /s/ Robert E. Mansen Robert E. Mayor Barnes discussed a letter received from the Illinois Commerce Commission on the proposed abandonment of bus service between Dixon and Rockford, Illinois. The clerk was instructed to notify the I.C.C. that the city is opposed to dropping this service.

Mayor Barnes advised that the city will continue fighting the mandatory chlorination imposed by the EPA.

Mayor Barnes commented on the deteriated condition of the Brinkman property located on Illinois Street. He will contact Mr. Mike Williams, Ogle County Health Officer, with the request that condemnation proceedings be started.

Chief Robert Jones addressed the Council informing them that he had a copy of the Certificate of Insurance for the Cub Scouts for their Soap Box Derby to be held June 25, 1983. He also reported to the council that Rochelle Disposal is picking up refuse in East Oregon. The Council advised Chief Jones to arrest the driver of the truck the next time he sees this being done.

Mayor Barnes reported that the city had a plugged sewer line on Webster and Second Street. The City of Dixon came to Oregon to assist with this problem. The clerk was directed to write to the City of Dixon City Council thanking them for their assistance and a carbon copy should be sent to the Dixon Telegraph.

The clerk was instructed to advise the Bruce Municipal Equipment Company that the city will rebid for the Water Jet-Sewer Cleaning Equipment.

Mayor Barnes and Commissioner Collins will be going to Springfield on June 3, 1983 regarding the Water Chlorination Bill HB 203.

There being no further business, Commissioner Braden moved that the meeting be adjourned. Seconded by Collins.
