## COUNCIL MEETING Monday May 24, 2004 City Hall Council Chambers

Mayor Tom Stone, Sr. signed a \$75,000.00 Cops Grant to be used for a new Police Officer.

Commissioner Nick Johnson announced that the Street department has put tablets in the catch basins for mosquito control. A Spring Clean up day is being worked on for the city. Tentatively it is set for June 19<sup>th</sup>.

Commissioner Jim Tegtmeyer announced that the landscaping in front of City Hall has been completed.

The water and sewer department are continuing to work with CMT and the IEPA for a plan on the violation of the radium in the water.

Mayor Tom Stone announced that he is working with ComEd to see if funds are available for street lighting in the downtown area.
