The Council of the City of Oregon met in regular session Monday, June 14, 1982 at 7:00 P.M., City Hall Building.

Present: James Barnes, Mayor and Commissioners Robert Aurand, Frank Svoboda, James Ludwig and Norman Collins.

Absent: None.

Also present: City Attorney David Smith, Chief of Police Robert Jones and City Clerk Julienne Crowley.

Mayor Barnes opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Commissioner Svoboda moved that the minutes of the May 24, 1982 meeting be approved as recorded. Seconded by Norman Collins.

Said motion carried on roll call as follows: Ayes: Aurand, Svoboda, Ludwig, Collins, Barnes. No nays.

Said motion carried on roll call as follows: Ayes: Aurand, Svoboda, Ludwig, Collins, Barnes. No nays.

Commissioner Aurand moved that the Annual Financial Statement submitted by Julienne Crowley, City Treasurer, for the fiscal year ending April 30, 1982 be approved and he further moved that said report be published once in the Republican Reporter newspaper in accordance with Illinois Revised Statutes Chapter 24, Section 3-10-5.1. Seconded by Frank Svoboda.

Said motion carried on roll call as follows: Ayes: Aurand, Svoboda, Ludwig, Collins, Barnes. No nays.

Mayor Barnes moved that Resolution #419, entitled "A Resolution Adopting Illinois Dept. of Labor Conciliation and Mediation Service Prevailing Rates for Construction Trades" be passed. He further moved that a public notice be published in the Republican Reporter newspaper on Thursday, June 17, 1982, advising the general public that copies of said rate determinations are on file at the City Clerk's office. Seconded by Norman Collins.

Said motion carried on roll call as follows: Ayes: Aurand, Svoboda, Ludwig, Collins, Barnes. No nays.

Mayor Barnes opened the Public Hearing on Federal Revenue Sharing Entitlement #13 Budget at 7:05 P.M.

Mayor Barnes gave the Council his recommendation for allocation of the Revenue Sharing Ent. #13 funds. There were no comments from the citizens present or the Council. Mayor Barnes then moved that the budget for Revenue Sharing Ent. #13 be accepted as stated. Seconded by Robert Aurand.

Said motion carried on roll call as follows: Ayes: Aurand, Svoboda, Ludwig, Collins, Barnes. No nays.

Public Hearing adjourned. Regular council meeting reconvened.

Commissioner Collins moved that Ordinance #865, an ordinance repealing Ordinance #856, concerning the sale of municipally owned real estate be passed. Seconded by Frank Svoboda.

Said motion carried on roll call as follows: Ayes: Aurand, Svoboda, Ludwig, Collins, Barnes. No nays.

Jim Allen, President of United Bank of Ogle County, addressed the Council requesting that the three parking spaces on the east side of Fifth Street, next to the Drive-In Bank, be restricted on parking time either by signs or meters. Commissioner Ludwig advised he would rather limit the parking by signs than meters. The Council agreed to have thirty minute parking signs installed.

There were many citizens present to express their concern over whether the existing boat docks, which are located on the newly acquired city property in the southeast end of the city, would have to be removed or could remain.

The Council agreed that no new docks will be permitted on the property until a further study can be made to determine the liability factor involved.

At 12:00 Noon Monday, June 14, 1982 a bid opening was held for a Motor Fuel Tax Street Project - Monroe Street. There were three bids submitted:

The engineer's estimate was \$126,952.25.

At 1:00 P.M., Monday, June 14, 1982 a bid opening for street work on Madison Street was held. There was one bid submitted:

Rockford Blacktop Construction, Rockford in the amount
of \$66,566.40

The engineers estimate was \$55,643.00.

Commissioner Ludwig moved to reject the bids for street projects for Monroe and Madison Streets. Seconded by Robert Aurand.

Said motion carried on roll call as follows: Ayes: Aurand, Svoboda, Ludwig, Collins, Barnes. No nays.

The Council agreed to wait until next year to rebid for street projects.

Chief Jones advised the Council that on a drunk driving arrest, the courts are requesting that government bodies designate by Resolution which tests they wish to use to determine whether the subject is intoxicated or not. The Council agreed to designate the breathalyzer or intoxilizer test. A Resolution will be prepared to act on at the next meeting and a certified copy will be submitted to the court.

Mayor Barnes moved that Ordinance #863, entitled Title 5 - Business Regulations Chapter 4 - Liquor, introduced and filed for public inspection May 10, 1982, be passed. Seconded by Frank Svoboda.

Said motion carried on roll call as follows: Ayes: Aurand, Svoboda, Ludwig, Collins, Barnes. No nays.

Commissioner Ludwig moved that Ordinance #864, entitled Title 3 - Public Ways and Property - Chapter 8 "Parkways and Terraces", introduced and filed for public inspection May 10, 1982 be passed. Seconded by Frank Svoboda.

Said motion carried on roll call as follows: Svoboda, Ludwig, Collins, Barnes. Nays: Aurand.

Commissioner Aurand moved that Mayor Barnes be authorized to sign an agreement between the City and Bureau of the Census for a special census to be taken. He further moved that a check in the amount of \$3,465.00 be forwarded to the Bureau of Census along with the signed agreement. The amount being the Bureau of Census cost for the census. Seconded by James Ludwig.

Said motion carried on roll call as follows: Ayes: Aurand, Svoboda, Ludwig, Collins, Barnes. No nays.

There being no further business, Commissioner Aurand moved that the meeting be adjourned. Seconded by James Ludwig.
