The Council decided to let Wendler Engineering and Willett, Hofmann Engineers get together and work out a solution.

Mayor Barnes advised that the new drug store going in on North Fourth Street wants to pave their parking lots, a large one on Third Street and one on Fourth and Franklin. The water will either run into the city sewer or into the street and into the sewer. Barnes advised them they could not do that so they proposed to put a line from their parking lot down to the corner of Third & Franklin.

Barnes proposed to them that if they would run a storm drain from the corner of Franklin and Third Streets down to the river, that the City would pay half of the cost. The City in turn would hook in the city drains on the corner of Third & Franklin to that line. At Third & Franklin, the drug store will put in a catch basin and then the City will tie the other catch basins in and add to the line to the river.

The cost would be \$6,590.00 to the City to tie in at the corner. The City would pay half of the \$6,360.00 for the line going from the line from the corner to the river. These quotes were from Hardesty Excavating. This would be a 15 inch pipe. Bernie Klingenberg questioned if this was the size of pipe recommended in the separation of sewers plan. Klingenberg is going to check the plans as the Council feels the pipe should be the recommended size. Commissioner Aurand advised to get a price before the next meeting.
