Discussion: Commissioner Aurand advised that he had received an inquiry questioning the wisdom of the curfew. The Council agreed to change the time back to the state statutes requirement.

Mayor Barnes advised the Council that he and Commissioner Aurand had come up with the following conditions to accept Woods Equipment Company request to hook into the city sewer.

Woods
Request

Allow Woods to build the lift station and force main. The City accept it and maintain it. The first 5 years, Woods pays all over \$10,000.00 in maintenance; Years 6 through 15, Woods pays 50% on anything over \$10,000.00 in maintenance. On sewage charges the first 2 years - no charge; years 3 and 4 they would pay 1/3 of the regular out of city charges; Years 5 & 6 the charges would be 2/3 the regular out of city charges; Year 7 and on the rate would be at full out of city rates. If Woods ever becomes contiguous to the City they would be required to annex to the City. The Council was all in favor of this proposal.

The Council reviewed two solutions to the excessive water readings submitted by Commissioner Aurand and Svoboda. They will make a decision at the next council meeting.

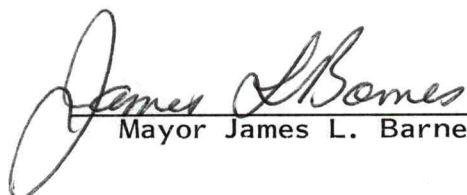
Derek Harkema, Transitional Living Program representative, addressed the Council with information on different options he is pursuing in the event that he does not get a contract with DCFS.
