COUNCIL MEETING JULY 23, 2001

The Council of the City of Oregon met Monday July 23, 2001, 7:00 P.M. Council Chambers.

Tom Stone started the pledge of allegiance.

Chief Miller let the council know that they have been doing background checks on the applicants that have applied for the police officer position. They have interviewed Randy Craft and he comes highly recommended. With the Council's approval he would like to hire Randy effective July 30, 2001. Mayor Mike Arians moved to hire Randy Craft as a police officer effective July 30, 2001, Seconded by Commissioner Gerald Medlar.

Commissioner Jim Lauer introduced Nate Mattison the Rec/Coliseum Board Chairman. Nate has been working with Thomas Houck from Willett Hofmann & Assoc. They have come up with a wish list of things that they would like to see done at the Coliseum building. Also Pam Blickem from Kishwaukee College was present to inform the council that there are potential matching grants available for the coliseum building. The council discussed the way that they could utilize the building. She would like to know if the council would like her to move forward with the procedure. The consensus of the council was to move forward so that they can look at the figures to see if it's possible.

Sharon Pepin and Neil Stechschulte from MSA gave a brief presentation on comprehensive plans. They went over information to help achieve a successful plan and handed out a folder of information for the council to look over in the future. Commissioner Amy Trimble indicated that the council needs to move forward so that we can apply for grant money to help pay for the comprehensive plan and to set up a committee. Commissioner Amy Trimble moved to proceed with the planning of a comprehensive plan and make the Plan Commission the designated group, Seconded by Commissioner Jim Lauer.

The council discussed setting up an ordinance to appoint a Depot/Museum Board. A ruff draft was put together for the council to look over. Commissioner Jim Lauer would like to change a few things with the ordinance and discuss it at the next meeting.

Commissioner Jim Lauer stated that the storm sewer project is ahead of schedule and on budget. A few of the businesses are connected to the combined sewer system that will become the sanitary sewer system. They need to disconnect these inlets. Jim has been working with Matt Hansen from Willett Hofmann & Assoc. to come up with an estimate of how much it would cost. Jim would like to have it done while the streets are torn up. The consensus of the council was to move forward with this project.

Commissioner Jim Lauer introduced Bob Rees and Jerry Stoffer they are the gentlemen in charge of the restoration group for the depot building. They will be having an auction August 10, 2001 at 6:00 P.M. so if anyone would like to donate things they can bring them to the depot building.

The City Clerk and Chief Miller have been working on an ordinance that would address the consumption of alcohol outside of the licensed premises. Currently two of the liquor establishments have patios and this would help to control any unauthorized sell of alcohol. The current codebook does not address these patios. Commissioner Tom Stone moved to pass Ordinance No. 1166 Consumption of Alcohol on Premises, Seconded by Commissioner Gerald Medlar.
