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Commissioner Collins moved that Ordinance #968, an ordinance amending Chapter 8 "Solid Waste", Section 8-10 "Pick Up" be introduced and filed for public inspection.

Commissioner Logan moved that Ordinance #966, levying a tax to provide Working Cash Funds for the City of Oregon commencing on the 1st day of May, 1988 and ending on the 30th day of April 1989 be passed. He further moved that the City Clerk be directed to file one certified copy of said ordinance with the County Clerk of Ogle County. Seconded by Norman Collins.

Commissioner Logan moved that the public hearing scheduled on Ordinance #965, Tax Levy, be rescheduled to August 8, 1988 at 7:20 P.M., due to an error on the size of the public notice as published in the Republican Reporter newspaper.

Roll Call: Ayes: Collins, Crenshaw, Lauer, Logan, Barnes. No nays.

Commissioner Lauer moved that Resolution #494, requesting the closing of Rt. 2 and Rt. 64 for the purpose of using the highways during Autumn on Parade be passed.

Seconded by Roger Logan.

Roll Call: Ayes: Collins, Crenshaw, Lauer, Logan, Barnes. No nays.

Commissioner Logan moved that the Budget submitted to the Council July 1, 1988 be approved. Seconded by Jim Lauer.

Mayor Barnes expressed his concern on the funds budgeted for equipment. Commissioner Logan advised that there were several items listed which may or may not be purchased.

Roll Call: Ayes: Collins, Crenshaw, Lauer, Logan. Nays: Barnes.

Commissioner Logan moved that the audit report filed by Lindgren, Callihan, Van Osdol and Company covering the City's financial transactions for the fiscal year beginning May 1, 1987 and ending April 30, 1988 be accepted. He further moved that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to sign said report and that the Clerk be instructed to forward one copy of the financial statement and one copy of the supplemental report to the State Comptroller. Seconded by Jim Lauer.

Roll Call: Ayes: Collins, Crenshaw, Lauer, Logan, Barnes. No nays.

Mayor Barnes moved that the recommendation of the Planning Commission in regard to the Oregon Park District West water-sewer connections be approved.

Motion died for lack of a second.

Student Government Report: No report at this time.

Commissioner Crenshaw mentioned the letter received from Attorney George Fisher in regard to the Svoboda issue. She stated that she apparently misunderstood the ordinance passed in regard to seeking outside counsel in the event there was a conflict. She stated she called Attorney Smith and he advised her he did some work for one party involved and so she made an appointment with another attorney. She stated she then found out that she should have brought it to the Council for approval. After a discussion, Attorney Smith advised that it was not a conflict and it was up to the Council to decide if there is a conflict, not one person.

Attorney Fisher addressed the Council and gave his opinion on conflict and procedures to follow to seek additional counsel.

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Attorney Fisher addressed the Council in regard to the two properties in the City that do not have water meters. The research to find the easements, right of ways and allowances goes back a hundred years and he asked for consideration for the City to do the research because of the cost involved. Commissioner Logan volunteered to research the old City records. The Council agreed to that.

A Public Hearing was held at 7:40 P.M. in regard to the proposed appropriation ordinance. There were no comments or questions.

Commissioner Logan moved that Ordinance #964, Appropriation Ordinance, introduced and filed for public inspection on July 11, 1988 be passed. He further moved that the City Clerk be instructed to place a notice in the newspaper advising the general public that said ordinance is being published in pamphlet form and that copies are available at the office of the City Clerk during normal business hours upon request.

Seconded by Gail Crenshaw.

Roll Call: Ayes: Collins, Crenshaw, Lauer, Logan, Barnes. No nays.

Commissioner Logan moved that all regular full time and permanent part time City employees be granted a pay increase of 3% and that an additional 2% merit increase be granted at the discretion of and upon recommendation of the department superintendent. He further moved that these increases become effective with the payroll period commencing July 25, 1988. Seconded by Norman Collins.

Mayor Barnes requested that the Council approve the City participation in the Illinois Automotive Corridor program. The cost is \$2,000.00 a year and the City would be included in the literature sent out to prospective businesses which may locate in Illinois. The Council approved.

There being no further business, Commissioner Collins moved that the meeting Adjournment be adjourned.
