Commissioner Ludwig advised the council of the following letter from Bob Brown, owner of National Clothing House: August 8, 1983 City Council City of Oregon, Illinois Lady and Gentlemen: In reference to replacing sidewalk adjacent to National Clothing Store: 388 square feet along east side 280 square feet along south side Based on an estimate provided by Max Newcomer the total cost will be \$4443.20. The area under the sidewalk is finished and used for storage. Our alternatives are to close the doorways off and fill the area in with sand and pour sidewalk or replace the steel and decking to span the storage area. We prefer to keep our storage area and request that the City pay for onehalf the project cost or \$2200.00. It appears that filling the area and pouring new sidewalk would cost approximately that amount which customarily has totally been paid by the City. After discussion, Commissioner Ludwig recommended that the city pay \$1,002.00 of the cost with the stipulation that Brown submit a set of plans for the project prior to construction to the City Council and that the city engineer oversee and inspect the project construction. The council agreed.

Commissioner Svoboda advised the council that J. L. Allum has requested that he not be charged a minimum sewer charge on the basement meter below Decker Drug Store since only approximately 1000 gallons of water has gone through the meter in the past year. The council agreed that as long as the sewer and water are in service, the minimum sewer charge would be charged. Commissioner Svoboda will advise Mr. Allum.

Commissioner Collins reports that he received an estimate of \$282.00 for electric work at Mix Park from Brown Electric. The council approved to proceed with the work.

Melvin Toomsen and Gerald Medlar inquired as to the status of their liquor license applications. Toomsen, D/B/A Feederlot at Conover Square, having been on file since March 28, 1983 and Medlar for a proposed bowling alley on the Pines Road, having been on file since July 1, 1983. After discussion, the council advised Toomsen and Medlar that a decision had not been made at this time.

Dave Davis addressed the council to advise that a group of parents were organizing events and activities to try to deal with the alcohol misuse among teenagers. Davis requested the city's cooperation and support of the group. On Saturday, August 6th, there were some problems that stemmed from a dance the group held at the Park District tennis courts. After discussion, the problems were resolved.

In regard to the First Street sewer line, Culligan has still not responded with an easement. The council agreed to notify them and give them 30 days to either allow an easement or a detour route will be planned and the city will proceed with the project.

The council discussed putting in a water line from Jefferson north on First Street to the northeast corner of Route #64. The engineer is to get a cost estimate on the proposed project.

The fairgrounds board requested that the sewer rate be waived during the period of October through April since the sewer is not used, just water used for the track. The council denied this request.
