City Clerk Julianne Crowley introduced Karin Santos and Marcelo Trevisani, college students from Brazil, who are staying in her home for the duration of their stay in the United States. Mayor Barnes presented them with City of Oregon mugs.

Donna Mann, CCI Project Facilitator, gave the Council an overview of the proposed plan of action of the CCI Committee.

Reports

John Jones explained to the Council his interest in putting in a hydro plant at the Oregon Dam. He explained he has been looking into this for several years.

Karen Long, an Eighth Street resident, questioned when Eighth Street was going to be open to get into their driveways and the garbage trucks can get down the street. Commissioner Suneson advised that the contractor should be hauling gravel in on Wednesday and the street department employees will take the garbage to the corner for residents until that time.

Commissioner Aurand questioned whether the downtown businesses, who put things on the sidewalk, had submitted insurance certificates to the City.

Commissioner Aurand advised that some time ago the Council passed a motion to look into a building code. He asked if it wouldn't be prudent to go ahead with a building code for new buildings or new additions to existing structures. He advised that perhaps put an ordinance in place and have a date of January 1, 1996 as effective date to allow any construction in progress at this time to be completed. Mayor Barnes will contact BOCA and have something at the next meeting.

Tim Zidek addressed the Council with an objection of the Jefferson Street extension, which will come out next to his house at Adams & Tenth Street.

There being no further business, Commissioner Aurand moved that the meeting be adjourned.
Seconded by Gerald Medlar.

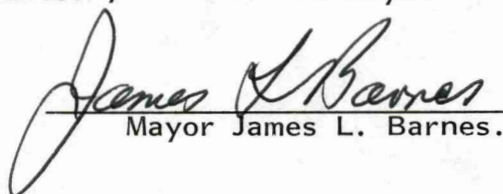
