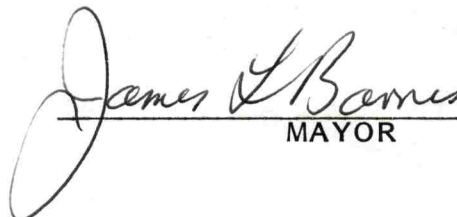

Seconded by Elma Braden.

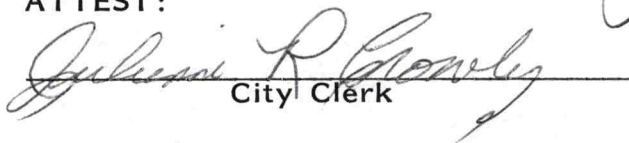
