Commissioner Crenshaw Report:

Reports

1. Advised that Walter Janssen will be retiring in six months and she has hired Roger Warrenfelts to train for the Disposal Plant position. Warrenfelts will start September 26, 1988.
2. The Student Government Committee is working with teachers and parents on the building code ordinance and liquor ordinance.
3. The Grant application has passed the first review and representatives from DCCA will be in Oregon on September 20th for a sight review of the proposed project.

Commissioner Collins Report:

1. He has received the first B&B license application and will be inspecting the premises soon.
2. Demolition of the house on Hastings Ave. is completed.

Chief Miller Report:

1. Gave the August police activity report.
2. Asked if it would be possible to have speed signs erected on Oregon Trail Road by the Park District entrance. This will have to be checked with the County.

Commissioner Logan Report:

1. Advised that the group health insurance premium with Time Insurance will be increased by 40% on November 1, 1988. Guist Agency is checking into different companies for the City.
2. Requested that Autumn on Parade Committee provide the City with a certificate of Insurance. Commissioner Collins will take care of this.

Commissioner Lauer Report:

1. Third Street construction is completed.
2. Sidewalk work has been started.
3. Advised that Gary Robinson is hauling in junk cars again. Attorney Smith advised he is to go to court on September 30. A notice on this violation will be sent out.
4. Discussed the possibility or maybe a joint venture between the City and Park District to get a track built for skate boards and bike riders.
5. Advised he would like to get the engineering started on a comprehensive plan for the City.

Mayor Barnes Report:

1. Advised he had attended his first meeting on the Illinois Automotive Corridor.
2. Advised that Dan Pratt is anxious to get the T.V. cable franchise renewed for 15 years.

The Council approved the issuance of two raffle licenses - A Dozen Plus 1 and Pheasants Forever.

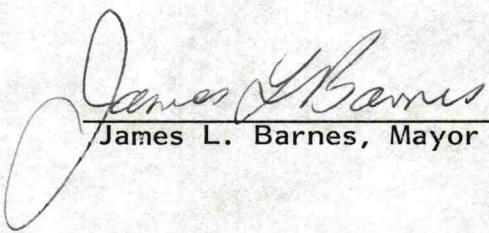

Seconded by Gail Crenshaw.

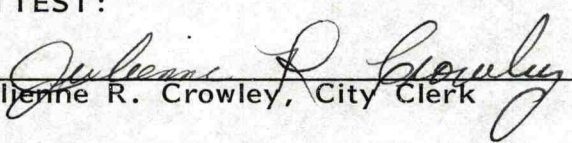
